
A Letter from the Director

"ABIDING in Him, ABOUNDING in fruit"

On a given Tuesday, you might find me walking down a village path in India, staring out an office window or chopping onions in my kitchen asking the Lord two simple questions from a book I read this year, "Living Fearless" by Jamie Winship:

Lord, what do you want me to know about this? And what do you want me to do?

For me, these questions are a simple and profound reminder of the truths of Jesus in John 15,





I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful... Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine...I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing... If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples.

I can do nothing without Jesus, our team can do nothing without Jesus. We need him, every day, all the time. When we bear fruit with him, he will surely prune us so that we can be even more fruitful for the "Father's glory" and to show that we are truly his disciples. When we remain in him, we can ask whatever we wish and he will do it. Wow, what profound truths and promises to walk in as we make disciples of the unreached nations in the world today!

While we were at a training of local leaders this year in South Asia, one of our partners stood up, giving testimony to the partnership we've had in the gospel. He said,



"What you have taught us is making us fruitful in our people group, now ALL the believers know how to share about Jesus and stand on their own feet. We know for sure that there are now over 800 disciples in our area!

Come and see with your own eyes!"

And we have gone to see with our eyes, the local team has trained more leaders, set up more mission points to send disciples to, are working through deeper scripture access solutions and are innovating sustainable solutions for the local disciple makers to further the mission with the resources from their own hands and lands.







One disciple-maker, Samuel, has a new petrol and convenience shop, another has a growing goat herd, another a piggery, chickens etc. The local faith leaders are, in their words, "standing on their own feet" and are modeling to their churches and community – and it is multiplying. Why? Because it's what Jesus has told them to do, and they see it in themselves to do it and he is giving fruit. Tears welled up in my eyes as I saw the glorious sight of Great Commission ownership, strategy, suffering and celebration in them.

As so many of you already know, at Activate Global, this is what we live for! The stories and numbers you will read in this report are an inspiring reflection of our partners in the gospel. And just as nutrients, water, and sun are used by God to bring abundant harvest, so the work of the gospel is fueled through your generosity, prayers, and support!

Simply stated, I can't believe God is letting us be a part of it all!

As we seek Jesus for what lies ahead, we sense a stirring to believe for **more fruit for the Father's glory!** If you could peer into our team meetings, you'd see us crying out,



500 PEOPLE GROUPS reached with the gospel

Over 7,000 people groups still lack access to the gospel, and we are committed to reaching at least 500 of them by 2026. Already, 217 new groups have heard the message of Jesus, and we are pressing forward to reach 283 more in the next two years. Every connection made is another step toward a world where no one is without the hope of Christ.



25 CHURCH PARTNERSHIPS accelerating the mission

We believe the local church is God's design for making disciples and spreading the gospel. We are thrilled to celebrate that our goal of 25 church partnerships has been reached—two years ahead of schedule! But the mission doesn't stop here. As God continues to move, we look forward to many more churches linking arms to accelerate gospel impact.



1000 KINGDOM BUSINESSES sustaining church planters

Sustainable transformation happens when local disciple-makers are equipped to thrive. Our goal is to launch 1,000 Kingdom Businesses by 2026, providing economic stability and gospel impact in unreached areas. With 629 businesses already established, we are trusting God to raise up 371 more that will support long-term, local mission efforts.



700 CHURCHES PLANTED

among the unreached

God has exceeded our expectations—901 churches have already been planted among the unreached, surpassing our initial goal ahead of schedule! These churches are not just growing but *multiplying*, creating movements that expand the reach of the gospel in places where it has never been heard before.

A Letter from the Chairman

"and still, MORE WILL BE ADDED"

We serve a God of abundance who calls us to resist a scarcity mindset. At Activate, we speak often about multiplication, and we measure our impact by witnessing the multiplication of good things: disciples making disciples, churches planting churches, villages being transformed, kingdom businesses taking root, and leaders equipping leaders.

While we diligently carry out the work to which we are called, we remain humbled and awed by the reality that true transformation is a result of God's mysterious and powerful work. This truth is reflected in the ministry of Jesus. When crowds gathered around Him, He often taught through parables, revealing hidden truths and encouraging His listeners to engage deeply. In one such moment, Jesus challenged His audience to invest generously:

"With the measure you use, it will be measured to you—and still more will be added. For to the one who has, more will be given; and from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away" (Mark 4:24-25).

Recently, while visiting a bustling market in Central Asia, this principle became strikingly tangible. Among the many stalls was a merchant whose generosity mirrored Jesus' teaching. He offered abundant handfuls of samples—nuts, spices, and sweets—to passersby, and when it came time for customers to buy, he would measure out double the amount they paid for. His actions embodied a spirit of generosity that inspires us at Activate. We aim to live and lead with that same open-handed approach, trusting that with the measure we use, it will indeed be measured to us—and still more will be added!





Year after year, we see this promise come to life as we step out in faith to invest in more leaders, in more nations, among more unreached people groups. By holding tightly to Jesus' words and promises, we witness His abundance at work in ways that exceed all expectation.

One of the tools that guides our ministry strategy is the "Four Fields" framework. This model lays out a path from entering new fields to harvesting reproducing churches and is rooted in the parable of the growing seed found in Mark 4:26-29.


In this parable, a farmer sows seeds and then rests, rising each day as the seeds sprout, grow, and mature—a process that occurs beyond the farmer's understanding or control. Yet the farmer remains expectant, preparing for the harvest, and when the time comes, he eagerly puts the sickle to the crop. This is a picture of kingdom work: a partnership with God. We sow faithfully, knowing that He alone brings the harvest.

As we enter 2025, we remain committed to this partnership and to the vision of multiplication, stepping out in bold faith and open generosity, trusting that God's abundance will continue to overflow.

To Him be all the glory as we press on together.











MULTIPLICATION

More growth in 6 months than previous 6 years!

In South Asia, our national partners are boldly advancing the gospel among the unreached. They train church planters, equipping them to share their faith with confidence. During training, participants complete lessons and then go out in pairs to neighboring villages to spread the gospel. They understand that reaching the over 27 million unreached in their nation requires one key method—multiplication through fearless evangelism.

In 2024, we have seen God move through our South Asian partners in extraordinary ways. In just six months, more has been accomplished than in the last six years combined. Over 600 locals have caught the vision for church planting, and more than 300 leaders have been trained. The number of trainers equipped for sustainable church planting has surged from four to, at last count, 105! As a result, thousands have come to Christ in this year alone.

As this work has grown, so has its reach
Our South Asian partners are now leading efforts
in a neighboring nation where fear remains a
significant obstacle to the gospel. These local pastors
often conduct their services in locked rooms, keeping
the 787,000 unreached people outside. To address
this challenge, our partners have introduced vision
casting and kingdom business training, encouraging
these believers to step beyond their fears and engage
their communities.

While navigating this hesitation, the Lord provided an important lesson through one of our teams. A young Activate partner was sharing the gospel in a village when he asked a woman if she had ever heard of Jesus. She replied that she had never heard His name before and eagerly asked to learn more. He shared the gospel with her, and she believed. Shortly after, he was taken to the police station for questioning.

"I didn't know how to answer the questions I was being asked," he later recounted. "I sent word to my pastor (another Activate partner), and he arrived just in time to join the interrogation. Through the leading of the Holy Spirit, he had the right answers, and by an act of God Himself, we were released."

This experience deepened their understanding of what it means to share the gospel in a resistant nation—a testimony they carried with them into the neighboring nation they were reaching out to.

Soon after, one dear sister in that nation was walking down the street carrying some personal materials. The top sheet of paper read three simple words:

Jesus Loves Me

She was arrested and remains detained today. Fear always fights back. Despite this opposition, our partners remain steadfast. They are committed to growing the work in their nation and their neighboring one, knowing that we must become all things to all people to win some. The gospel must be shared boldly, trusting that the Holy Spirit will prepare hearts to receive it. They continue to lead by testimony and teaching, patiently waiting for fruitfulness to emerge. Above all, they ask for prayers—that a national partner team will rise up so this new region will begin reaching their own people.

Since the beginning, one truth has remained unchanged: Jesus' love never fails. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, we are set free. This freedom is not determined by life's trials, not even prison walls. God is with us. He is with our sister in a jail. He is with our national partners in South Asia. He is with each of us.

"For though I am free from all, I have made myself a servant to all, that I might win more of them. To the Jews I became as a Jew, in order to win Jews. To those under the law I became as one under the law (though not being myself under the law) that I might win those under the law. To those outside the law I became as one outside the law (not being outside the law of God but under the law of Christ) that I might win those outside the law. To the weak I became weak, that I might win the weak. I have become all things to all people, that by all means I might save some. I do it all for the sake of the gospel, that I may share with them in its blessings."

Abdo: A Veterinarian's Love for His Enemies

Abdo, a veterinarian in Africa, saw his work as more than just a business—it was a bridge to reach his enemies. The Arab community, once responsible for genocide in his region, now controlled livestock breeding after stealing the herds from the locals. Though they were difficult to connect with, when they brought their animals to his clinic, Abdo welcomed them with tea—an act of hospitality deeply rooted in their culture.

Word spread: "*Go to Abdo—he serves tea and welcomes us.*" His kindness and honesty built trust, opening doors that had once been closed. Through prayer and patience, he formed relationships that led many Muslims to Christ. His clinic became a quiet but powerful place for ministry.

Then war came. His clinic was bombed, forcing him to flee to a nearby nation. But Abdo's calling wasn't over. He was invited to a year-long discipleship training, where he now prepares to return to his homeland—determined to rebuild his practice, serve tea once again, and continue making disciples among the very people who once persecuted his own.

Reflecting on his journey, Abdo says,

How kind is God to give me this profession so I can minister to my enemies.





NIGERIA EXPANSION

CAPRO/JIGI Collaboration

In Nigeria, more Christians are **killed for their faith than in any other country in the world . . . COMBINED.*

Nigeria, the most populous nation in Africa, is home to nearly twice as many people as Ethiopia, the second most populous country. It's also considered the wealthiest country in Africa, largely due to its substantial oil reserves, as well as its agricultural production and rapidly growing tech sector. The population is almost equally divided between Muslims and Christians, with frequent tensions clashing between these two groups, especially in the central states of the country.

In the early 2000s, a militant group named Boko Haram began to rise in power. Their name translates as "Western education is forbidden," reflecting their ideological opposition to Western influence, particularly Christianity.

Boko Haram has terrorized Nigeria for years. Many survivors of these attacks are left without livelihoods and severe trauma. One of the most high-profile incidents occurred in April 2014, when the group abducted 276 girls from the Government Girls Secondary School in Chibok, a predominantly Christian town. These girls were forced to convert to Islam and marry members of Boko Haram.

In 2023 alone, "more than 8,000 Christians were reported killed, earning Nigeria the tragic distinction of the world's center of Christian martyrs (christianpost.com)." This violence has understandably led many churches and organizations in Nigeria to focus inward, avoiding outreach to Muslim communities due to fear and the difficulty of access. In many cases, these Muslim communities remain "out of sight, out of mind."

However, one organization, CAPRO | JIGI, is dedicated to taking the gospel to their unreached Muslim neighbors. Realizing they lacked effective access to closed Muslim communities, they saw business as a potential avenue—but initially only as a charitable activity, not as a sustainable strategy for making disciples and supporting church planters. This is why two years ago, the Executive Director of CAPRO | JIGI reached out to Activate Global to host a Kingdom Business Training event in Nigeria.

At the time, Activate Global was overwhelmed with other commitments and unable to take on another country. Instead, we offered online training and occasional Zoom meetings, hoping this would suffice. But CAPRO's leadership persisted, desiring in-person training.

In Psalms 11:3, it says, "If the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do?" In Nigeria, many foundations have been broken, and rebuilding them is essential. Activate Global believed God wanted us to partner with CAPRO | JIGI to see what He could do through the righteous, when foundations are restored. After two years of prayer and determination, their request was finally answered.

In August 2024, a team of three Activate Global trainers arrived in Abuja, Nigeria, to host a five-day Kingdom Business Training for CAPRO's missionaries, trainers, and business owners. The atmosphere was electric with anticipation, and the training proved to be powerful.



Many of the testimonies from that training captured the essence of Activate Global's mission. Two participants reflected;

"The old model of missions isn't working. We must adapt if we are to reach the unreached."

"The first lesson for me was the realization that we have hundreds of people groups in Nigeria, and WE CAN REACH THEM through Kingdom Businesses."

Since then, the participants have hit the ground running. They have trained over 145 leaders across Nigeria, shifted businesses to become disciple-making ventures, and desire to integrate Activate's Kingdom Business material into their mission training schools. They now have the tools to live in closed communities, address local challenges through business, build relationships, and make disciples.

The partnership between Activate Global and CAPRO | JIGI aims to help rebuild the foundations of what God can do through His people. A strong foundation is essential for stability, but it can also serve as a launchpad. In this case, the goal is to shift mindsets around how Kingdom Business can transform the way church planting is carried out in hostile and/or closed environments.

CAPRO | JIGI has seen their persistent prayers come to life, and a wildfire of change is spreading across Nigeria.

Together, we pray for a nation where Christians are no longer martyrs but see many come to faith in Christ. We pray for a country where the nation kneels at the feet of Jesus, becoming a beacon of hope and a launchpad for planting sustainable churches across Nigeria and beyond.



SHIFT IN MISSIONS TODAY

Polycentric Mission

Many religions claim some geographic location as their holy center– Hindus claim Varanasi as a sacred destination, Muslims consider Mecca as their holiest site, Jews claim Jerusalem as their spiritual center. Christianity, however, from its origin "contained no geographic center, no ethnic majority, no linguistic monopoly, and no holy language." As we see in the book of Acts, Christianity did not stay centralized in its place of origin, rather it spread quickly to the surrounding continents: Asia, Africa, and Europe. Jesus Himself summarized it best when He promised:

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." Acts 1:8

Christianity began in the Middle East and quickly spread to the rest of the world; it did not stay centered in Jerusalem, nor was it ever meant to. As the tides of history shifted, so too did the concentration of Christianity across the world, from the Middle East towards Europe (around 8th to 19th century). Then given a call for Protestants in the West to work towards the fulfillment of the Great Commission during the nineteenth century, there was a large spread of the gospel primarily moving from Europe and the United States to the Majority World (Africa, Asia, and Latin America).

That is why during the nineteenth century, the phrase "from the West to the rest" is often used to describe the sending trends of missionaries.

Moving to our present day twenty-first century, the World Christian Database reported that, as of 2020, the United States ranked number one in *sending* the most number of missionaries to other countries.²

But did you know that the United States also received the most number of missionaries into its borders?

Now more than ever, there is a beautiful trend of more countries both sending and receiving missionaries. Even more incredible is that missionaries are being sent from countries where Christianity is not the majority religion!

A trending term within the global mission's world to help capture this pattern is *polycentric mission*. Polycentric simply meaning "multiple centers". Where "from the West to the rest" denotes a single center (the West), we see a shift back to polycentric mission. The gospel has taken root in the Majority world. The mission fields of the past century have been transformed into mission forces in our current century! People are owning the responsibility of obeying Jesus' commands, and we are seeing a return to sharing God's Father-heart for all people in all nations by all people in all nations.

Allen Yeh has further pushed the conversation "from the West to the rest" to "from everyone to everywhere."

Over time, focus has shifted from 'place' to 'person'. It is vital, not only to consider where people are being sent from, but to also consider who is being sent. Context, culture, giftings, affinities, skills, and capacities all matter, as each person is able to bring something different, something unique to the kingdom work.


This matters all the more as we see patterns in global movement show an increase in migration and people movement all across the world. Population groups are spread out across different regions outside of their country of origin. More people of different cultural and ethnic backgrounds are rubbing shoulders with each other, yet nearly 9 out of 10 Muslims and Hindus in the world still do not personally know a Christian.



This lack of contact perpetuates the idea that Christianity is a Western religion. Thus, the rise in equipping and sending people from all centers of the world is a call into obedience, strategically leveraging the uniqueness of every believer to play their roles in fulfilling the Great Commission. This reality is why Activate Global is dedicated to supporting and investing in locally based national leaders, with the faith of seeing disciple-making accelerated among the Unreached.








Our Strategy

Activate Global's focus is to empower local, indigenous church planters for long-term sustainability. To accomplish this goal, our strategy involves imparting our teachings to a select group of leaders initially. These individuals, designated as *Trainer of Trainers* (TOT), serve as our frontline team. They subsequently assume responsibility for overseeing specific regions, where they engage in teaching, training, coaching, and mentoring church planters in disciple-making methods and Kingdom Business.

At Activate Global, we firmly believe ministry and business are not separate pathways; instead, they can beautifully intertwine to facilitate fulfilling the Great Commission.



We launch our training with a "Vision Casting" session to help participants see Kingdom Business as a route to accelerating disciple making work. We set a foundation, reiterating multiple times to **start small**, **be faithful**, **persevere**, and **trust God for the results**.



The effectiveness, we have discovered, of a Kingdom Business reaching Unreached People Groups is:



It offers a viable and beneficial purpose for being present in the community without arousing concerns.



It provides a natural way to build relationships (i.e.customers).



It shifts mindsets as observers witness the integration of business and disciple-making activities, empowering them to follow suit.

Our Training


At the heart of our Kingdom Business Training lies many biblical examples showcasing individuals who engaged in both ministry and business simultaneously.


Our twelve lessons are divided into two modules for effective learning. We conduct training for one module at a time, allowing participants ample time to complete homework assignments that include market research, writing a business plan, budget creation, etc.

Participants who have completed Module 1's homework are invited back to join Module 2.

Each module is conducted over four or five days, with one day dedicated for participants to teach a lesson back to the class. This serves to gauge comprehension and provide them with practice.

We utilize icons and images to reinforce the lesson topics throughout our curriculum. By the completion of the twelve lessons, participants will have compiled a page filled with icons, each serving as a reminder of the lesson learned and its practical application. These images are especially helpful to our oral learners, which is the majority of the nations and people groups we serve!


A "HEALTHY" CHURCH

and the Discipline of Data

What defines a healthy church, and how do we ensure that growth does not come at the expense of spiritual vitality? As the gospel spreads and churches multiply, it is essential to anchor ourselves in biblical principles while also engaging in the discipline of data. Acts 2 provides a model for church health, outlining key elements such as teaching, fellowship, prayer, and evangelism. However, tracking these markers across rapidly growing movements requires intentionality. By faithfully measuring impact, identifying areas of strength and need, and stewarding resources wisely, we can ensure that church multiplication and generational growth of churches remains both biblically sound and strategically effective.

A Healthy Church

As the gospel spreads, some people (seekers) are eager and curious to learn more about who Jesus is before committing their lives to Him. Often, we refer to a gathering predominantly composed of seekers or a newly established group of new believers as a "Fellowship". As seekers become believers and are discipled in the way of Jesus, those disciples are gathered into groups we call "Churches". What determines a healthy church? The best standard, of course, is the Bible. We find a beautiful description of the early church in Acts, with important elements that are relevant even today. As churches multiply, we do not want to risk losing the health of a church over rapidity. One of the ways we measure and train leaders in church health is through a study on Acts 2 and the "Church Health Circle" that is sown below. Each of the icons on the circle represents an important element to the health of a growing, and often young, church as outlined in Acts 2:37-47.



We see in Acts 2:42 "And they devoted themselves...", denoting that they actively chose to commit themselves as a group to being together. Therefore, a church is only a church if they self-identify as a church. To identify church commitment, the button on the bottom is clicked and the dotted circle becomes a solid green circle! A HEALTHY CHURCH!











The Discipline of Data

Multiplication from God is a gift. Keeping track of rapid multiplication is also a challenge. As our number of partners increases, along with the number of nations we operate in, tracking house churches, Kingdom Businesses, training, and leaders becomes a discipline that we must actively engage in so our collected data accurately reflects the impact. Alongside impact, data collection is so important in identifying gaps and helping us to know what is next to best serve and support our partners. Some questions we regularly consider:


- Where are areas of health and growth for churches?
- What bible studies can we do to help partners grow in a component of a healthy church?
- What areas do leaders need more support in?
- Given our resources, skills, finances, etc., how can we best steward what has been entrusted to us?
- What is the Spirit uniquely doing in certain ministry fields, and how do we continue following His lead?

Pressing into these questions can be uncomfortable. They challenge us to step over our cultural assumptions into unfamiliar topics most do not regularly consider. It is in these moments we find ourselves most humbled, brought to our knees in awe of how God works. He uses our limitations, our questions and multiplies the answers into greater glory for Himself!

A problem known as "The Great Imbalance" in missions earmarked giving is staggering—99% of funds go to places where the gospel is already present, while only 1% reaches the 42% of the world with little to no gospel access.

Every dollar directly equips leaders and sustains church-planting movements in the world's most unreached areas.
